

CCH CANADIAN LIMITED LICENSE AGREEMENT

This is an agreement ("agreement") between CCH Canadian Limited ("CCH") and the licensee ("Customer") of this software and accompanying documentation. By opening the sealed package containing the CD-ROM, downloading the software or using it, the Customer agrees to be bound by the terms of this agreement. If Customer does not agree to the terms of this agreement, and Customer is the original purchaser of the software, promptly return the software (including printed materials) to CCH for a full refund within the 30 days following the delivery/download of the software.

SUBSCRIPTION PERIOD. This CCH software is sold on a 12-month subscription basis.

In consideration of the license fee paid (**Single User License Agreement**) for this software and accompanying documentation, CCH grants to Customer a non-exclusive license ("License") to use one copy of the Software on a single computer/workstation. "Software" means the CCH software, which may include electronic documentation, but which excludes certain components where Customer use shall be governed by the GNU General Public License to which Customer must agree to separately (the "GNU Software"). The Software is "in use" on a computer when it is loaded into the temporary memory (i.e., RAM) or installed into permanent memory (e.g., hard disk, CD-ROM drive, or other storage device) of that computer. Customer may not use the Software on or over a network or any other transfer device without each concurrent user having an original copy of the Software and its documentation. The Lite version of this CCH software is licensed for local installation (single use) only.

In consideration of the license fee paid (**Site License Agreement**) for this software and accompanying documentation, CCH grants to Customer a non-exclusive license ("License") to use the Software for up to 5 users at a single location within a corporation, proprietorship or legal partnership. An additional license fee applies for additional users (beyond 5) at that same single location. "Software" means the CCH software, which may include electronic documentation, but which excludes certain components where Customer use shall be governed by the GNU General Public License to which Customer must agree to separately (the "GNU Software"). The Software is "in use" on a computer when it is loaded into the temporary memory (i.e., RAM) or installed into the permanent memory (e.g., hard disk, CD-ROM drive, or other storage device) of that computer. This program is intended for the sole professional use of the Customer. Legal persons/entities with more than one site require a separate Software license per location. Separate corporations, proprietorships or legal partnerships that are sharing office space each require a separate Software license.

Customer may use the Software on a network, provided that Customer has a licensed copy of the Software for each computer that can access the Software over that network.

Customer may use this Software at multiple workstations only if there is no possibility of being used at two workstations simultaneously. Customer may use this Software for Customer off-site computers when there is no chance that someone will use this Software at Customer office. For example, Customer may have a laptop or home computer in addition to the computer at Customer office. A company with multiple locations (sites) must purchase multiple copies of this Software. Remote access from another site or location by a computer to a terminal or application hosting server requires that the remote location have a separate license.

Customer may not rent this Software

Periodically, CCH may introduce new versions, updates or releases of the software. All updates shall become part of the Software and be governed by the terms of this License Agreement.

Reported problems that can occur when using the Software are documented in the Release Notes and the Frequently Asked Questions; you are responsible for reading these notes.

Customer acknowledges that copyright subsists in the Software and Documentation and agrees never to challenge, directly or indirectly, the ownership or validity of this copyright. The Software and Documentation are being licensed, not sold, to Customer.

All intellectual property rights in the Software (including all animations, audio, images, maps, music, photographs, video, and text incorporated into the Software) are owned by CCH and its licensors and are protected by Canadian copyright laws and international treaty provisions. CCH and its licensors retain all rights not expressly granted. Customer must treat the Software like any other copyrighted material, except that Customer may make one copy of the Software solely for backup or archival purposes. Customer may not copy the printed materials accompanying the Software. You may not loan, rent, or lease the Software.

The Software is licensed to Customer only, and may not be sublicensed, transferred, rented, lent, sold or otherwise disposed of to a third party without CCH's prior written consent.

Customer may not reverse engineer, decompile, or disassemble the Software. Customer may not distribute printed copies of any user documentation provided in electronic format. The restrictions contained herein apply equally to hybrid CD-ROMs which may contain multiple versions of the Software for use on different operating systems.

CCH warrants that the media on which the Software is distributed are free from defects in materials and workmanship for a period of ninety (90) days from the time of receipt. Any and all other implied warranties with respect to the Software and the accompanying written materials, including but not limited to implied warranties of merchantability and fitness for a particular purpose, are limited to ninety (90) days.

A portion of the Software (the "Mozilla Component") was provided to and used by CCH pursuant to the Mozilla Public License. Customer may obtain a copy of the source code to the Mozilla Component by contacting CCH. If Customer obtains a copy of the source code to the Mozilla Component, then Customer rights in and to and Customer use of the source code to the Mozilla Component shall be governed by the Mozilla Public License and not by this license. In addition, Customer may obtain a copy of the source code to the GNU Software. Customer rights in and to and Customer use of the source code to the GNU Software shall be governed by the GNU General Public License.

Customer exclusive remedies shall be, at CCH's sole option, (a) the refund of the amount Customer paid for the Software or (b) the repair or replacement of the Software provided that the defective Software is returned to CCH or an authorized dealer within ninety (90) days from the date of purchase. This Limited Warranty is void if failure of the Software has resulted from accident, abuse, or misapplication. Any replacement Software will be warranted for the remainder of the original warranty period or thirty (30) days, whichever is longer.
